General Rick Hillier, CMM, MSC, CD

Born in Newfoundland and Labrador, General Rick Hillier joined the Canadian Forces as soon as he could. Having enrolled in 1973, he graduated from Memorial University of Newfoundland in 1975 with a Bachelor of Science Degree. After completing his armour officer classification training, he joined his first regiment, the 8th Canadian Hussars (Princess Louise's) in Petawawa, Ontario. Subsequently, he served with, and later commanded, the Royal Canadian Dragoons in Canada and Germany.

Throughout his career, General Hillier has had the privilege and pleasure of commanding troops from the platoon to multi-national formation level within Canada, Europe, Asia and the United States. He has worked as a staff officer in several headquarters, first at the Army level in Montreal and later at the strategic level in Ottawa.

In 1998 General Hillier was appointed as the first Canadian Deputy Commanding General of III Corps, US Army in Fort Hood, Texas. In 2000 he took command of NATO's Stabilization Force's (SFOR) Multinational Division (Southwest) in Bosnia-Herzegovina.

In May 2003 General Hillier was appointed as Commander of the Army and subsequently, in October 2003, he was selected as the Commander of the NATO-led International Security Assistance Force (ISAF) in Kabul, Afghanistan.

General Hillier was promoted to his present rank and assumed duties as the Chief of the Defence Staff on 4 February 2005.

General Hillier and his wife, Joyce, have two sons, Chris and Steven, a daughter-in-law, Chris' wife, Caroline, and a grandson, Jack, who has already learned to salute his grandfather.

General Hillier enjoys most recreational pursuits including hockey and golf.

She is currently enrolled in a joint nursing program at Confederation College and Lakehead University.

Air Cadet Award

Cadet Warrant Officer 1 Dhillon has represented Manitoba at the National Effective Speaking Competition. She has won the Air Force Association Medal and the Royal Canadian Legion Medal of Excellence. She visited Australia in the International Air Cadet Exchange program. She was the Student Affairs Prefect for her school. She has competed at the World Public Speaking and Debating Championships in the USA. She is the Minister of Public Relations for Youth Parliament of Manitoba and is a first year student at the University of Manitoba.

The Hubbell Awards have been presented for nearly forty years. They are named after Major Ted Hubbell who served in Canada with the Winnipeg Grenadiers during the war. After his death in 1967 the United Services Institute of Manitoba made the decision to pay tribute to his work with our youth by presenting a bursary to a cadet from each of the three elements every year.

The nominees must be a cadet in good standing and be a full time student. The selection criteria consist of: demonstrates the attributes of good citizenship; models the attributes of leadership; supports his/her sponsoring element; possesses a high level of physical fitness; and supports the community outside the cadet movement.

The Hubbell Awards was incorporated as a registered charity in 2005 to encourage donations to support our youth. The proceeds from this dinner will be used to help support the program.
